

MVN - MAKING A DIFFERENCE THE STORY OF AYYASAMY



Ayyasamy, a native of Tamil Nadu, India, was a devoted Hindu and a committee member of the local Hindu temple. He worked hard for the construction of the temple in his village. He was an influential, well-respected member of his Hindu community when tragedy befell him. He was addicted to alcohol; five of his children died; and his wife suffered from chronic sinus infection.

His life got even worse when an individual promised Ayyasamy a job overseas and then cheated him out of a huge sum of money. Frustrated and angry, Ayyasamy plotted to kill the person who cheated him. He ordered the blacksmith to make a sharp knife and then he waited for the precise moment to kill.

In the meantime, Ayyasamy's wife became very ill and a believer from the MVN Mission Center invited them to church. Ayyasamy and his wife went to church for the first time seeking healing. MVN Missionary Robert explained to them the boundless love of Jesus for mankind and His uniqueness and miracle-working power. Missionary Robert prayed for her and God healed her instantly.

AYYASAMY'S STORY CONTINUED

His wife found renewed strength in her body and joy in her spirit. She readily accepted Christ as her savior and became an active member of the church. Although Ayyasamy was reluctant to invite Jesus into his heart, M. Robert continued to pray for his salvation.

In God's appointed time, Ayyasamy accepted Christ as his personal savior and his life was transformed. His evil desire to murder disappeared from his mind. The sharp knife (killer weapon) he purchased is used by Ayyasamy to cut firewood these days. For the first time in his life, he knows peace and joy.

When the new church building was being constructed, a few village youth agitated and hindered the work. Ayyasamy, along with other believers, and the strength of God, boldly resisted these youth, allowing the church to be completed. Ayyasamy, who once toiled to see a Hindu temple built in his village, was now the front-runner in MVN's church construction.

Ayyasamy has suffered shame and rejection from his former friends since he accepted Christ and they shun him from their society. But he is unashamed of Jesus and eagerly shares the gospel of Jesus Christ.
