We are conducting a drive to provide sponsors for all our missionaries! Currently, MVN has 446 active missionaries spreading the gospel of Jesus Christ in India. Of these, 109 are self-supported and 159 already have sponsors providing their support. We have 178 missionaries relying on MVN for their basic needs. Sponsors commit to \$50 a month which covers their basic needs and they agree to pray regularly for their missionary. Presently, we have churches who sponsor up to 10 missionaries each; Sunday School classes sponsoring missionaries; individual donors sponsoring up to 20 missionaries each! We are so thankful for these sponsors and we pray God's continual blessings on them.


